


[Ocean Youth Program](#)



Announcement from Vice Chancellor, [Macquarie University](#)

Macquarie University has announced that any applicant who meets the criteria for their Early Entry Schemes, which offer students a place at Macquarie based on their Year 11 results, will be made an offer to study at Macquarie in 2021. There will be no cap on the number of students at the University level who will be admitted through these schemes to support students concerned about impacts to their study and ATAR results from the COVID-19 Pandemic. Caps will only exist at course level when there are government, legal, or other logistical restraints (clinical placements etc). For the first time Macquarie University is also announcing the removal of exemptions to courses available through their two early entry schemes - the Schools Recommendation Scheme (open now) and Leaders and Achievers Early Entry Scheme.



Educational Access Scheme (EAS) and COVID-19

Educational Access Schemes (EAS) aim to help individual students whose education has been negatively affected in a significant and sustained way for a period of at least six months throughout Year 11 and/or 12. In addition to the existing categories of disadvantage under which students may apply (including categories such as significant personal illness, severe family disruption and refugee status) UAC has advised that this year, students will be able to claim financial hardship if a parent or guardian has received Job Keeper or Job Seeker payments for at least three months from March 2020. In addition, students disadvantaged by COVID-19 in other ways may already be eligible to apply under at least one of the existing EAS categories relating to home environment and/or personal illness. Further details about this process are available from UAC.



Updates about University Courses

Opportunities for Women in Engineering, IT and Construction at UTS

UTS is strongly encouraging women to consider studying engineering, IT and/or construction. UCAT Information

The following information is important for students who are applying for Medical, Dental and Clinical Science degree programs in Australia or NSW and have already registered for UCAT. Testing occurs in July, so for a summary and preparation tips, click [here](#).

[UCAT Practice Tests and Resources](#)

Students are advised to prepare for the UCAT using the free official practice materials which have been developed by the UCAT Consortium. The UCAT Consortium believe that everyone should have access to free preparation materials to support their test preparation. The resources and advice have been produced by us using feedback from previous high-scoring candidates.

[UCAT Test Day](#)

You must arrive at least 30 minutes before your appointment time to complete the check-in process. If you arrive more than 15 minutes after your appointment time you will not be allowed to take the test and will have to book and pay for a new test appointment on another day, (subject to availability of test appointments). This applies in cases of family emergency, accident, transport problems and security alert as well as forgetfulness and lateness.

[UCAT Test Format](#)

The UCAT is a two-hour computer-based test which assesses a range of abilities identified by universities as important to practicing in the fields of Medicine/Dentistry/Clinical Sciences. The test consists of five separately timed subtests which each contain a number of questions in a multiple-choice format. Once started, the test cannot be paused for a break, however before each subtest, there is a timed instruction section. Candidates may sit the standard test or apply for an extended version of the test if they are entitled to extra time due to a documented medical condition or disability.
